The following week will see Tropak putting on a 25-minute show of its own at the European Festival in Burnaby (see back page of newsletter for further information). The show will begin at 1:30pm, and is part of a series of 25-minute music and dance performances by many cultural groups.

The European Festival will also have food stalls and information booths for each country, including one for Ukraine hosted by members from the IF Society.

Prior to these events, Tropak has participated in two multicultural evenings hosted by the Serbian dancers of Burnaby, and by the students of Princess Margaret Secondary School in Surrey.

Filip Konowal Memorial Rededication



The Vancouver area Ukrainian community is invited to participate in the Philip Konowal VC and Jack Mahony VC plaque dedication Saturday 16 May at 11am at the New Westminster armoury.

FILIP KONOWAL, VC Acting Corporal, 47th Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force **Decorations**: VC, BWM, VM, GVI CORONATION 1937, EIIR CORONATION 1953, CROSS OF ST GEORGE (4TH CLASS) RUSSIA

Born near Kudkiv, Ukraine, in 1888 (d. 1959), Filip Konowal immigrated to British Columbia in 1913. While serving as a Corporal with the 47th Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Force, he fought with exceptional valour in August 1917, near Lens, France. For this His Majesty King George V personally conferred the Victoria Cross on Konowal in London on 15 October 1917, stating, "Your exploit is one of the most daring and heroic in the history of my army. For this, accept my thanks."

Konowal also served with the Canadian Siberian Expeditionary Force, finally returning to Vancouver in June 1919, having served three years and 357 days.

Other Konowal memorials are at Notre Dame Cemetery, Cartier Square Armoury, Ottawa, and Royal Canadian Legion Branch 360 (Konowal) Toronto.

About the Club

Current Read

Death and the Penguin was written by Andrey Kurkov (born in 1961), one of the most successful Ukrainian authors in the post-Soviet era, and is featured highly on European bestsellers lists. Kurkov is the author of 13 novels and five children's books. His work is currently translated into 25 languages from Russian, which he uses for his writing.



About the book

Death and the Penguin, published in 1996, is a bleak, satirical work with surreal elements and dark humour. It follows the life of a young aspiring writer, Viktor Zolotaryov, in a struggling post- Soviet society.


The "Death" in the title refers to Viktor's job writing obituaries for a local newspaper. "Penguin" refers to Viktor's pet penguin Misha, a King Penguin obtained after the local zoo in Kyiv gave away its animals to those who could support them (a true story).

The story touches themes of loneliness, emotional relationships and

existentialism. *Death and the Penguin* contains a moving personal story, elements of mystery, suspense, mafia intrigue, and a surprise ending.

At our meeting of the Book Club on May 26, 2009 we will be discussing this book and will select a book for our summer read.
