



Special Documentary Film Show from "Babylon 13"

Two Ukrainian video-journalists of the Babylon 13 documentary film team, brothers Andriy and Pylyp Rozhen continue their cross-Canada tour showing documentary screenings of "The Winter That Changed Us" from the 2013/14 Maidan Revolution to more than 10,000 Canadians, including Prime Minister Steven Harper.

Driving over 16,000 km from Victoria to Newfoundland, and performing over 50 screenings of their film which was featured at the Cannes Film Festival, they showed Canadians a new Ukraine and the new Ukrainians. We were honoured to have them at The Ukrainian Centre.

Honouring the Late Olga Kotelko

This Book Club event was organized, by Theresa Herchak, and assisted by Anne Brandak and Darlene Scribilo, with help from Karen Widesky. The members of Ivan Franko Book Club hosted 32 people in our lounge with a special event introducing the book Olga: The O.K. Way to a Healthy, Happy Life by Olga Kotelko.

Olga Kotelko (2 March 1919 – 24 June 2014) was a Canadian nonagenarian track and field athlete. She held over 30 world records and won over 750 gold medals in her age group since she started competing at age 77, and was considered "one of the world's greatest athletes" as a result. She was well known in and respected by the Ukrainian community not only in the greater Vancouver area, where she lived, but throughout the world. She visited our Society several times.

Guest speakers Roxanne Davis who worked with Olga on the book, and editor, Michelle Carter provided interesting insights and background to the book itself - and gave us glimpses into Olga's amazing life! These two women surprised and entertained us as they recounted their experiences with Olga and with the writing of the book, with copies of the book available for purchase.

Olga's daughter Lynda also attended adding more about Olga's life and her passing. There was a special screening of excerpts from the documentary "Grey Glory" to see Olga in action! Refreshments included Ukrainian baking from the Eparchial Cook Book which Olga co-published.

Youth of Maidan Project Support

This past summer Ukrainians of Vancouver welcomed a group of 13 young students from Ukraine who participated in a summer program to improve their English, to meet new Canadian friends, and to experience our multicultural and democratic Canadian environment.

This program was organized by the **Open World Learning** (O.W.L., owl-study.com) Ukrainian Canadian Education and Charity Trust in response to the tragic revolutionary events at the *Maidan Independence Square in Kyiv, Ukraine,* in the winter of 2013/14. "Maidan" became synonymous with the "revolution of dignity" that changed Ukraine and Ukrainians forever.

This group known as the "**Youth of Maidan**" consisted of young activists who suffered severe physical injuries themselves, or whose fathers survived after being shot or burned, or who were killed by snipers at Maidan. These tragic events left scars in the hearts of most of the 46 million people in Ukraine but especially in those students who matured in just a few months. They inspired the world even more with their fearless approach to life and their willingness to risk their lives for the better future of Ukraine.

Financial aid and support was provided by our Society contributing significantly to travel expenses, and by providing home-stays for these Youth of Maidan who were financially limited to participate in this program while travelling to and living in Vancouver.

Kathryn Chyrski, born July 26, 1988 passed away suddenly in Richmond on September 17, 2014. She is survived by her loving parents Peter and Valerie, and her brother Andrew

The individual student we fully supported financially was 20 year old *Dmytro Tsarok* from *Vasylkiv*, near *Kyiv*. When "Maidan" started, his father became a "Maidaner" protesting the corrupt government of *Yanukoych*. In February 20, he was shot by 3 bullets from very close range. One of his dreams to commemorate his father was to further his activism for real independence and sovereignty of Ukraine. He learned to speak English and travelled to different countries which support Ukraine's Revolution of Dignity, returning to Ukraine sharing his experiences with people he met.

In his interview with our Society President, *Roman Herchak* before returning to Ukraine in September, Dmytro underscored his gratitude to our Society, and how he achieved his dream so much above his expectations because of our support for him. One day he may very well be one of Ukraine's top leaders. Our support was very well worthwhile!
