Ukraina Dance Ensemble

My name is Yevgeniya Razenkova and I am the founder of the Ukrainian dance ensemble "UKRAINA". The group started in January 2024 with the mission of preserving and promoting Ukrainian culture and its heritage. Initially formed as an adult dance group, the ensemble expanded in September 2024 to include a children's group which now trains at the Ukrainian Community Society of Ivan Franko. Yulya Rychkova is our choreographer and instructor.

We believe that collaboration strengthens our community and builds resilience. That was the motivation to partner with the Ivan Franko Society. By offering Ukrainian traditional dance classes at the Society, we aim to deepen children's connection to Ukraine – its music, dance traditions and cultural roots. Performances also play a vital role in inspiring young dancers and building their confidence.

Currently we run one children's group that trains on Friday evenings. After the summer break we are excited to expand and offer two age-specific classes: ages 6-9 years and ages 10-14 years.

The dance program is more than just classes – it's a place where children feel connected to their roots, express themselves creatively and develop a strong sense of identity and community. The smiles and excitement before performances, and the sense of belonging truly show the value of this initiative.

Brainchild Studio

My name is Anna Shylova, creator of the Brainchild studio. I arrived in Canada in 2023. I am a theater director and a musician. In Ukraine I worked in the "REMS" theater. I was also engaged in music, staging various performances and organizing festivals and concerts.

The Brainchild Studio was created to support Ukrainian children in Richmond – to help them adapt to their new country of Canada, to find like-minded people and for children to develop creatively in their Ukrainian community. The Ivan Franko Society was the perfect place to welcome The Brainchild Studio.

At the Brainchild Studio we sing, dance and recite. We participate in play training games and prepare for performances. Our lessons consist of warming up the body and moving plastically. We listen and move to the rhythms of music for body coordination. We practice pronunciation, learn tongue twisters



and practice acting skills. The lessons are adapted accordingly to the children's ability levels. Recently the Brainchild studio performed "Thumbelina". The dialogue in the play was English and the songs were sung in Ukrainian.

We invite children between the ages of 4 – 16 years to participate. Classes are held twice a week on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 4-6:30pm.

- **Senior** (11 to 14 yrs): 5:00 - 6:00 pm
- **Junior** (4 and 6 yrs): 6:00 - 6:30 pm

Ukrainian Nest

My name is Svitlana Maksymenko and I am the organizer of "Ukrainian Nest", a children's Ukrainian class held at the Ukrainian Community Society of Ivan Franko.

In March 2023 I attended a workshop at the Ivan Franko center. At that time there were no Ukrainian children's programs in

Richmond .It was then that I decided to propose teaching a Ukrainian class for children at the center.

The children who attend the class learn Ukrainian language, history, baking, cooking and traditions. The classes are very interactive and communicative. The children have the opportunity to celebrate traditions for

Easter and Christmas. Occasionally the children go to the cinema and watch Ukrainian films.

The goals of the Ukrainian children's class is to give children the opportunity to connect with their history, honor traditions and

ensure they don't forget them. It is also important for them to learn their first language, meet friends in the community and try not to feel so far from Ukraine.

The children's class started with only 6 participants and now the class has grown to 16. Currently the class offers activities for children between the ages of 5-10 years. I am hopeful to provide a program for children over the age of 10 in September 2025.

Ukrainian Language Classes For Adults

My name is Alla Dudka and I am a Ukrainian language teacher. Before moving to Canada in 2022, I taught Ukrainian language at Kharkiv National Medical University and at Istanbul University in Türkiye. In September 2022, it was a pleasure to partner with the Ukrainian Community Society of Ivan Franko to offer conversational Ukrainian Language classes via zoom. We started with one class of 4 students and we have grown to 12 students enrolled in three classes ranging from a beginner's class with no Ukrainian language experience to an advanced intermediate class.

We are currently taking a summer break but, we are looking forward to resuming our classes in September. If you are interested in learning Ukrainian or brushing up on your speaking and reading skills, consider enrolling for our next set of lessons in the

fall. Each lesson set is 10 weeks long. We offer the following options:

Beginners Level 1:

Designed for students with no prior experience in Ukrainian or those who only know the alphabet and a few basic words. The weekly lessons will focus on foundational vocabulary and simple phrases. Classes take place on Monday evenings for 1 hour via Zoom.

Beginners Level 2:

For students with some Ukrainian language experience. Participants in this level are familiar with basic vocabulary, can build simple dialogues and texts, and have been introduced to Ukrainian grammatical cases. This class is ideal for those who have completed at least 2-3 lesson sets and have a solid basic understanding of reading and

speaking. Classes are held on Monday evenings for 1 hour via Zoom.

Intermediate Level:

This class is for students who have been studying Ukrainian for 2-3 years. Participants are comfortable holding basic conversations and continue to build confidence in grammar and conversational fluency. Emphasis is placed on mastering grammar structures and improving natural speaking skills.

Classes are 1 hour and 15 minutes long and held via Zoom. The exact evening (likely Tuesday or Thursday) will be confirmed soon.


- Learn why Ivan Franko is often called the father of the Ukrainian nation.

New Acquisition




Sweet Darusya by Maria Matios
Sweet Darusya is a historical novel set in Ukraine during the 19th century. It follows the life of Darusya, a young woman from a small village who becomes a teacher and a leader in her community. The book is filled with vivid descriptions of the landscape, the customs of the time, and the challenges faced by the people.
